At the 97<sup>th</sup> annual national convention two resolutions that pertain to this standing chair were given for action and awareness. One on Multiple Chemical Sensitivity and Environmental Sensitivities and the other Banning the Marketing of Unhealthy Foods and Beverages to Children. Encourage members to become aware of these issues and educate themselves. Once there is education and awareness, action plans can begin. ### **Environment**

Under environment the national focus will be water. Here are some questions that Rita Janes, sub-committee chair compiled:

- Why nearly 2,000 communities in Canada live under boil water advisories?
- Why has the number of protected rivers and lakes dropped dramatically in recent years?  
(99% of rivers and lakes are presently unprotected)
- Will the 2017 North America Free Trade Agreement, presently being negotiated with the United States and Mexico, ensure Canada's waters are protected?
- Why 73% of First Nations communities have water systems at medium to high risk?
- How is water being affected by industrial pollution along rivers, such as fracking, oil and gas drilling, hydroelectric developments?
- What is happening over the relicensing of the Nestle water bottling plant in Ontario?
- What is the effect of retreating glaciers on the water supply?
- Why does Canada not have a national water strategy?

### **Education**

The National Bursary Fund aids members pursuing education in areas of spiritual growth, adult faith formation, youth ministry, ministry to patients in palliative care, ministry to shut-ins, parliamentary procedure or literacy tutoring. Councils and

members are asked to donate funds to this bursary. Educating our members in these various areas helps us all.

## **Health**

Mental health will be the focus of the National Chair, Fran Lucas. Watch for more information in the coming months on this important issue. There is so much to learn and be aware of-stay tuned.

The Euthanasia Prevention Coalition posted on their website that the Canadian Mental Health Association opposes "MAiD" euthanasia for psychiatric reasons and should remain illegal. The CMHA recommended that the government:

- support recovery services and supports
- continue to invest in community mental health and addiction services and supports
- develop a national suicide prevention strategy
- invest in research to accurately predict and understand the course of illness in mental health and substance abuse
