#### **Ontario Spark's Report**

Summertime! This final issue of the Catch the Fire! Newsletter arrives as councils are on their summer break. Still, CWL activities continues as our provincial and national councils are preparing for their respective conventions. We look forward to seeing many of you at the provincial convention in Cobourg July 6 - 9th where Catch the Fire! is the Monday Night entertainment theme.

> Since the April newsletter the Fire! Catch workshops were held in

Hamilton, Kingston, Thunder Bay and Timmins dioceses. A grand total of 1462 members have been trained in Ontario since July 2013 to present.

The focus of this issue is the final three Catch the Fire! modules, Hospitality of the Hearth, Pass the Flame and **Wildfire** which summarizes workshop content and participants learning. Members thoroughly enjoyed participating in the Catch the Fire! workshops and it is evident that wildfires are spreading to ignite our councils and the League in the coming years.

Catch the Fire! was an ambitious, basic League leadership training program that was unveiled at the 2012 national convention in Edmonton. We were sent forth with the quote from Catherine of Sienna "Be who you are meant to be and you will set the world on fire!" As your Ontario Sparks, we enjoyed being able to facilitate this newsletter to share "Good Things Glow in Ontario" Best wishes as we all embrace the **S'mores** workshops the next phase of the League Leadership training.

#### the Fire! Featured Catch **Modules** (10 - 12)

Hospitality of the Hearth: "Were not our hearts burning within us while He was talking to us on the road? (Luke This module participants are 24:32). asked to be still as they reflect on their experiences during the training, engage in a prayer service and closes with everyone singing of "Christ, Be Our Light".

**Pass the Flame:** The goal is to spread the fire by evaluating this Catch the Fire! workshop with the following questions:



- What resonated with you?
- What did you like?
- What did you learn today?
- What future plans might grow from the workshop?
- How can we improve?

Wildfire: This is the review module and the inspiration is "The light of Christ be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you". Facilitators review the training, focusing on what participants will take back to their councils with their renewed League knowledge and tools to be fire-starters. These will help others better understand the League and take leadership opportunities. It closes with members forming inner and outer circles moving the music of "This Little Light of Mine" and when the music stops make a sign of the cross on the forehead head "The light of Christ be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." Campfire edible treats are shared as participants complete the evaluation and S'mores list for future workshop suggestions.


# We are Set For Our 67<sup>th</sup> Annual Convention in Cobourg July 6 – 9, 2014
