Featured Catch the Fire! Modules Light, Warmth and Energy

Light: Luke 11:36 is the inspiration for this module. "If then your whole body is full of light, with no part of it in darkness, it will be as full of light as when a lamp gives you light with its rays." One of the activities is members' testimonials when their faith was enriched through their involvement in the League. One of The Objects of the League is to unite Catholic women of Canada to achieve individual and collective spiritual development.

Warmth: This module opens with the question, "What does sisterhood mean to you?" Participants are engaged in a



meditative activity on what the sisterhood means to them as members of the League. The goal is to celebrate the opportunity for friendships as members of the League. This cumulates with some of the ladies processing to

the sacred space with the names of the ladies on the friendship chain as the remainder hold up their candles while the song "Go Light Your World" is being played.

Energy: "Lord, let the fire of Your love burn within us as we do Your work". This module looks at standing committees using the Constitution & Bylaws, National Manual of Policy and Procedure and the Executive Handbook. A notable fact in this section is the number 16,228 which represents the potential of having all standing committees being filled with a chairperson at all level of the League. This section closes off with the importance of annual reports.


