Humber Valley Speaks Out

On December 17th 2011 the CWL councils of Immaculate Conception, St Margaret Mary and St Padre Pio combined. Representatives met with the Honourable Julian Fantino MP Vaughan to discuss the legal challenge made by the British Columbia Civil Liberties Association to the Attorney General of Canada regarding the decriminalization of Assisted Suicide and Euthanasia in Canada. Encouraged by Minister Fantino's support the Project Challenge was born.

Phase 1 was launched at the

Toronto Diocesan 90th **Annual Convention in May** 2012. Display boards and pamphlets provided information on Euthanasia and Assisted Suicide and the dangers it posed, specifically for people with disabilities and the vulnerable elderly. **Phase 2** carried the message further to the community of Vaughan. On September 20, 2012 over 120 guests and speakers attended the Euthanasia and Elder Care Awareness Evening at **Immaculate Conception** Parish in Woodbridge. The presentations by Minister

Fantino, Father Robert O'Brien, Spiritual Advisor for the CWL Diocese of Toronto, and representatives from Hospice Vaughan and Toronto Right to Life were well received. Attention was given to the care of the elderly and hospice care. Truly a community effort!

funds for literacy programs in the St. Patrick parish elementary schools as well as building relationships with community, parents and church.



In their report on hunger and food banks use in Canada titled, *Hunger Count 2012*, Food Banks Canada states "The need for Canada's charitable food assistance programs grew in 2012, and they are now assisting more people than ever. In March 2012, 882,188 people received food from a food bank in Canada.

The ten most needed items at a food bank are: baby formula, canned meals, juice boxes, canned fish/meat, soup, canned fruit, powdered milk, canned vegetables, pasta & pasta sauce, and healthy cereal. The full report can be read at:

Joseph and Mary faced a death threat against their son. Upon divine counsel, they sought asylum in Egypt. Just as The Holy Family had to flee out of Israel, there are many people today who are being driven out of their homeland.

Refugees are people who have been forced to flee their country because of persecution, war, or violence. In Syria alone there are currently almost 400,000 refugees either registered or waiting for registration in neighbouring countries.

The theme of Pope Benedict XVI's annual message for the 99th World Day of Migrants and Refugees, is "Migrations: pilgrimage of faith and hope". His message contains many principles of Catholic social teaching: the call to family, community and participation; rights and responsibilities; helping the poor and vulnerable; solidarity; protection for asylum seekers and refugees; respect for human rights and dignity. The day will be celebrated on January 20.
