Legislation – Preparing a Brief

One of the roles and responsibilities of the Legislation Standing Committee Chair is the preparation of briefs and position papers on proposed legislation. Although this is not something done often there are some excellent resources available to assist you. The first of these is the **Resolutions Supplement** to the Executive Handbook page 5 and 6,

Composing the Brief. A brief is a short statement or summary expressing the League's position on a certain topic. It is prepared from positions expressed in adopted resolutions or from the input of members responding to a discussion paper and is used as the basic document to make a presentation or submission to a public forum. Care must be taken to ensure accurate

information and proper form in the brief as it could have wide public circulation. Always remember to get approval before circulating a brief from your president, at all levels.



Annual Retreat – with a "Twist of Lemon"

Update on Resolution ON.12.02

The action plan related to the above resolution passed at the July 2012 convention encourage members to write letters to the Provincial Minister of Health and Long -Term Care to enact legislation to prohibit access to indoor tanning equipment for youth under the age of 18. On March 7, 2013, Health Minister Deb Matthews introduced Bill 30 - An Act to regulate the selling and marketing of tanning services and ultraviolet light treatments, into the Ontario Legislature. The bill calls for a complete ban of tanning salon use by any person under the age of 18. The private members bill is expected to pass with the support of the NDP. The persistent work and dedication of the members of the Catholic Women's League across Ontario has made this legislation a reality. Keep the letters to the MPPs of Ontario going in support of this new legislation.
