# **Ontario Provincial Meetings with Government**



Planning begins immediately following the National Convention. All the National and Provincial Resolutions that were accepted at the two conventions are compiled into a brief. The brief is sent to the Assembly of Catholic Bishops of Ontario (ACBO) prior to the meeting with the Provincial President and

President-Elect each September. Copies of the briefs are sent to the Premier and the Opposition Critic Leaders. Invitations and copies of the brief are also sent to the Members of Provincial Parliament that we wish to have an audience with. Dates and times are coordinated through the Minister's administrative secretaries. During our 30-minute meetings with the MPPs, current resolutions and concerns that members have brought forward are discussed. The Ministers and/or their Senior Policy

Advisors inform us as to where the Government stands on the issues and what sort of follow-up might be expected in the future. Following the meetings a report is drafted by the **Government Visiting** Committee, which consists of the president, president-elect, pastpresident, legislation and resolution chairpersons. Further action items are sent out to the members through the various committees.
