Why the butterfly?

#### Reflections on GUIDANCE

When I meditated on the word GUIDANCE, I kept seeing "dance" at the end of the word. I remember reading that doing God's will is a lot like dancing. When two people try to lead, nothing feels right. The movement doesn't flow with the music, and everything is quite uncomfortable and jerky.

When one person realizes and lets the other lead, both bodies begin to flow with the music. One gives gentle cues, perhaps with a nudge to the back or by pressing lightly in one direction or another. It's as if two become one body, moving beautifully. The dance takes surrender, willingness, and attentiveness from one person and gentle guidance and skill from the other.

My eyes drew back to the word GUIDANCE. When I saw "G," I thought of God, followed by "u" and "i." "God, "u" and "i" dance."! God, you, and I dance. This statement is what guidance means.

As I lowered my head, I became willing to trust that I would get guidance about my life. Once again, I became willing to let God lead.

Dance together with God, trusting Him to lead and to guide you through each season of your life. Lord, guide us in your gentle mercy, for left to ourselves we cannot do your will.

We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, forever and ever. AMEN

## Tips when Planning Catch the Fire! in your Parish



Parishes across the province have one more year to plan and host *Catch the Fire!*Presentations. Barb Dowding National Organization Chair has stated that "through *Catch the Fire!* it is hoped that participants will experience our treasure, the faith, fun and fulfillment that we gain by belonging to the League."

Here are a few tips when planning a presentation in your parish:

- 1. Plan how to best reach out to the women in your parish
  - a. Invite and welcome all women
  - b. Plan for your parish or a cluster of parishes
- 2. Gather your team
  - a. Ideally have four facilitators
  - b. Plan together and keep in touch with one another
- 3. Advertise well in advance
  - a. Prepare eye catching posters / use the bulletin / use personal invitation
  - b. Be inclusive
- 4. Gather resources
  - a. Prepare a kit with required resources (there should be one in your diocese
  - b. Presentations require use of a laptop, LC projector, speakers and screen
- 5. Prepare the location
  - a. Make the room "ablaze" and bring your enthusiasm.
  - b. Use bright colours / dress the part
- 6. Post the overall goal and objectives
  - a. Use visuals posters for each objective / post them as you go through the day
  - b. Use soft music in quiet times.
