The following is a submission from **Fr. Jerome, Diocesan Spiritual Advisor** from the diocese of Alexandria-Cornwall who attended the Provincial Convention for the first time in July:

Paging the Bible where this theme of the 2014 CWL Provincial Convention is located, I found the following texts:

WE HAVE SEEN THE LORD. (John 20:24).

This was a group testimony of the disciples who were witnesses of the Risen Lord to the doubting Thomas. Gathered in a locked and dark room, Jesus stood by them. The disciples sorrow turned to joy.

I HAVE SEEN THE LORD (John 20:18)

Having encountered personally the Risen Lord, now Mary Magdalene went proclaiming to the downcast disciples, **I HAVE SEEN THE LORD**. It was for her a journey from despair, looking for the stolen body of Jesus towards coming to faith in the risen Christ, and to the joy of announcing this good news.

The appearances of the Risen Lord were powerful encounters transforming the disciples. In turn, the disciples who witnessed the Risen Lord became incredible testimonies moving individuals and communities to believe in the Risen Lord. From despair the disciples journey to Emmaus with their on hearts on fire; From tears of sadness, Mary Magdalene looks for a lost body, until her joyful faith proclamation; From hardened disbelief and conditionality (a doubting Thomas); to belief and sheer surrender; From hopelessness (Peter back to fishing), to a renewed vision and mission.

The CWL CONVENTION was an occasion of faith sharing experiences and of listening to each other's joy and frustrations. The solemn liturgical celebrations where we brought all our successes and not-so-successful plans were filled with gratitude to the transforming power of the Risen Lord. The socials in the evening were filled with such joy of a family.

To all CWL members and spiritual advisors, the CONVENTION 2014 was an authentic encounter with the Risen Lord. I can honestly say: **I HAVE SEEN THE LORD!** Listening to the charitable work, involvement in parish activities, and resolutions made to protect the dignity of life, I could only see the transforming power of the Risen Lord ever alive today.

How can we keep that fire burning in our hearts? How can we enkindle many more with the light of the Risen Lord?

As we part ways, back to our respective parishes, the challenge remains: "Modern men and women listen more to WITNESSES than to PREACHERS; and if they listen to preachers, it is because they are witnesses." (Evangeli Nuntiandi).

I look forward to the CWL 2015 CONVENTION.

Congratulations!! St. Margaret Mary CWL Parish Council Celebrates 65 Years of Service

Sunday October 5th, 2014 will mark the 65th Anniversary of St. Margaret Mary's Catholic Women's League Parish Council, Cumberland, Ontario. What a wonderful milestone to celebrate the "life" and "heart" that its members have brought to the parish and community at large. Originally called the "Rural Women's Club", the club was formed on February 23, 1949. On October 5, 1949 the members decided to join the Catholic Women's League, almost two years before St. Margaret Mary church was built. In September 1964, it was unanimously agreed to change the name of the Parish Council to St. Margaret Mary. The CWL Charter identifies Margaret Paquette as the Council's first President and Bertha Fitzpatrick-Fogarty as our first Secretary. Father Paul Mondou was the Spiritual Advisor. Since 1949, the Council has been blessed with many dedicated women who have taken active roles in the affairs of their faith, community and society. St. Margaret Mary CWL Parish Council will be marking this anniversary with a Mass at 10am October 5th followed by a social gathering where all parishioners are invited to browse through the Council's collection of historical photo albums, memorabilia and displays.

Bellelle Guerin Award

On June 13, 2014, at their regular monthly meeting, Genevieve Jourdain was recognized for her years of dedicated service with the Bellelle Guerin award from Our Lady of Lourdes Catholic Women's League.

Bellelle Guerin was the first president of the Catholic Women's League of Canada. This award is presented to an individual who have been a member of the League in good standing for at least 25 years, has served on the Parish and Diocesan executive and has demonstrated her love of the League through her words and actions.

Genny served three terms on the Diocesan Executive Council as Resolutions Convenor, Corresponding Secretary and Recording Secretary.

She has been a member of Our Lady of Lourdes CWL Council for 31 years serving in several positions but most effectively as President and has been an unwavering source of information and direction.

Not only a League member she has been a member of the Parish Council for a number of years. She has been a lecture, Eucharistic Minister, brings communion to the sick and shut-ins and is a member of the choir.

Our Lady of Lourdes CWL Council was formed in 1962 and is the only First Nations Catholic League Council in Ontario.

91st Annual Ottawa Diocesan Convention

On May 3, 2014 the 91st Annual Ottawa Diocesan Convention was held in the hall of St. Philip's Parish, in Richmond. Two guest speakers captured the hearts of those in attendance. Patricia Guylay, from Canadian Catholic Missions had a wonderful presentation on the northern missions in Canada. The Catholic Missions were the recipient of the conventions charity collection. Marsha Wilson, Executive Director, for St. Joe's Women's Centre spoke on the issues which face the women who frequent this centre; issues which included abuse and trafficking. St. Joe's Women's Centre was the focus of the Ottawa Diocese's Social Justice Project for 2014. Marsha was absolutely overwhelmed by the generosity of the CWL members of the Ottawa Diocese. A 22 foot truck was needed to transport all of the items that had been collected, to the centre.
