Communication Skills 101

The most important communication skill we possess is the ability to listen effectively. Here are some hints for effective listening:

- **Tune in...** be prepared to listen; face the person you are listening to, make eye contact and remove all other distractions
- **Understand what you hear...** ask open ended questions to ensure you are following; listen for changes in tone of voice and watch for physical signs like agitation or aggression
- **Avoid miscommunication...** summarize what you heard in your own words before you give advice or instruction

These tips can be used in our prayer life as well. Listen to what the Lord has to say to you as you pray. Be open to His word. Be present as you pray. Set aside some time each day to say three Hail Marys and the League prayer for all members.
