Sole Hope

At **St. Alexander's Parish in Chelmsford**, we had a very successful "Sole Hope Project" which was organized and led by Emily Vinski.

Sole Hope involves making closed toed shoes for children in Uganda to protect them from jiggers. Jiggers are small sand fleas that burrow into the surface of the skin that is most exposed, usually feet. As they multiply infection and disease often result.



Our CWL members donated denim jeans, traced, cut, tabulated the shoe templates and contributed money to help pay the shipping cost to Uganda. The local people in Uganda will assemble the pieces into shoes while earning a wage.

Resolutions

Catholic Social Teaching and Resolutions are closely linked. The prophet Micah calls on people "to act justly, to love tenderly and to walk humbly with your God." (6:8) Every person on earth is entitled to dignity, food, shelter, work, education, social order, an equal share of resources, a share of creation, peace, just wages and religious freedom. When people lack some of these it leads to suffering and oppression. To improve the plight of the less fortunate, changes must be made in the social and political structures. Through resolutions the League can work to change social conditions that lead the suffering of God's people.

For example, the dependence on food banks is a sign of injustice in society. Perhaps the causes could be the less-than-adequate social assistance, the lack of affordable housing or other social problems. Is there a resolution that could be studied to improve the situation?

Our mission, as League members, is to free people from oppression and work to change the social conditions that lead to suffering. My resolution could state:

- **Whereas**, The Catholic Women's League of Canada is a national organization, rooted in gospel values, calling its members to holiness, through service to the people of God; and
- **Whereas**, by their faith, Christians are required to show active concern to form a just and fair society; therefore, be it
- **Resolved** That League members will work to change social and political structures by researching and writing resolutions; and be it further
- **Resolved** That League members will implement the action plans of previously adopted resolutions.
