Community Life Special Report

Sisters in Spirit Gathering



On October 4, 2016 a special gathering was held on Parliament Hill, Ottawa for the missing and murdered Indigenous women. This was the 10th anniversary of the event held by the families of these women. The purpose is to seek justice for these women including renowned Inuit artist Annie Pootoogook, whose body was recently found in the Rideau River, in Ottawa. The circumstances surrounding her death are currently under investigation.

Hundreds of Canadians including dozens from the Ottawa Inuit community and members of Annie's family, prayed, sang, stood in silence and heard heart felt pleas. The Catholic Women's League members in attendance showed their solidarity with our Aboriginal sisters. All members are encouraged to continue to pray for these missing and murdered women, their families and the national inquiry.

Prime Minister Justin Trudeau took part in the gathering. This was the first time a prime minister had attended this event. He acknowledged the frustration felt by the families who have waited 10 years for a national inquiry to be called. He acknowledged that solutions will not be immediate, but that it was a start.
