The Pandemic with its lockdowns made life simpler in some aspects as it brought everything to a screeching halt for many of us. Our lives can be very hectic and sometimes overwhelming, so a reprieve gave us time to breathe and re-evaluate what we are doing and how we are doing it. At the same time, we were losing contact with our executive members and parish presidents because we could not gather together as usual. but have decided to do this virtually in the fall of this year, even if only for a morning session.

I have learned that I am not too old to learn new technologies; I can now host a Zoom meeting and incorporate various features.

I have learned to be flexible, i.e. constantly changing the dates and plans of our diocesan AGM, going from excitement about different aspects only to then be disappointed and have to accept what could not be changed. The lockdown rules were sometimes confusing as each district was dealing with a different scenario.

I appreciate the support of the diocesan team and everyone's patience with my efforts as I sometimes fumbled my way through. Everyone is doing the best they can under the circumstances, and I am looking forward to giving everyone a big hug in the near future.
