Coady International Institute

Councils are asked to show this video from the Coady International Institute (https://www.youtube.com/watch?app=desktop&v=G4Bm6QtA6CI) to their members. The institute educates women worldwide to become community leaders, and Margaret mentioned a program of interest is the *Indigenous Women in Community Leadership* program (which is open to First Nations, Métis and Inuit women).

Environment

Margaret reminded us, "The League will soon be using a new national theme, but caring for the environment should not be put away on a shelf. Members must always be diligent about what they do to the world around them. For example, the lack of clean water remains an issue in many communities and landfills are being used to the maximum. While recycling is improving, there is still a long way to go."

Earth Action Initiative

The League was invited to participate in the *Earth Action Initiative* sponsored by the World Union of Catholic Women's Organisation. Members were encouraged to choose any day in September to participate in an environmental clean-up project.

Here are a few suggestions for each of us to help care for the environment:

- 1) Reduce your own use of plastic products.
- 2) Re-use your plastic containers as often as possible.
- 3) Recycle plastics that you can no longer use.
- 4) Ensure that plastics are not contaminated (i.e. food waste) before recycling
