I would like to highlight the "100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Toronto Diocese". Formed in 1921, comprising of seven regions. I was part of the 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary committee, chaired by Mary Hawkley – Life Member. Throughout the year members participated in various activities that were put together.

First project was a challenge to all members to create a logo, there were many submissions, the chosen fitted very well with Mary, Our Lady of Good Counsel in the middle, our name on her cape, the seal surrounded by the years and the motto at the bottom which flows, from the Leagues' new mission statement spoke to our past, the present and what we wish to be, was turned it into a brooch, it got sold-out very quickly, proved to be a good fund-raiser, that paid for all the celebrations that were lined up. **Second project** kept all Toronto councils busy gathering information, about 70% of the councils responded and it made for a wonderful visual display, a slide show was done, viewed at the virtual celebration on June 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2021, exact date of the 100<sup>th</sup> year, founding of the Toronto Diocesan Council. Next project was the Diocese history book, project led by Patricia Cross - Life Member, Volume-I of 80 years was until 2001. We completed Volume-2 adding the next twenty years until 2021, special events and projects done, were Members and clergy joined us, in-person at St. Michael's highlighted in the book. Cathedral Basilica on October 7, 2021, for the celebration of our Centennial Mass. Before Mass we recited the Luminous Mysteries. We were excited to learn that about 1,750 people viewed the Mass via live streaming.

We also had a Time Capsule that was created by Life Member Karen Lawless in 1996. Asked the councils if they wanted to add anything to it and have it passed to me to add when we opened it. I had this capsule in my possession when I was president-elect.

The celebration ended this year on April 29<sup>th</sup>, 2022, at the Diocesan convention, with each member receiving a pewter bracelet. Opened the Time Capsule, the present executives read letters that were written to them by executives in 1996. In fact, I read my letter that was written by Margaret Ann Jacobs, now an Honorary Life member.

At the end of the Closing Mass the Time capsule was blessed, with more things added along with all the present executives letters, that will be read when it will be opened perhaps in the next 20/25 years. A true celebration of sisterhood, we celebrated our One Hundred Years: Growing in Faith, Love & Service.
