Resolutions Update:

In July, two new resolutions were adopted at the Ontario Provincial Council's 2022 AMM.

ON.22.01 Improve Care in Long Term Care Homes - gifted by the Pembroke Diocese ON.22.02 National Strategy to Address Loneliness – gifted by the Toronto Diocese

The resolution ON.22.02 – National Strategy to Address Loneliness was also submitted to the national resolutions committee for consideration. The national committee has advised that this resolution will not be presented at the 102<sup>nd</sup> annual national convention. However, the committee did recognize the importance of this topic and has advised that this resolution will be forwarded to the national chairperson of education and health to focus on loneliness through a communique and action by councils and members.

Next Steps:

As we begin a new CWL season, we should all be exploring ideas **NOW** for resolutions topics to be presented for the year 2023. Resolution development is a process that takes some time. - What is the issue?
- What are the facts?
- Who would we ask to make the changes?
- Can members take action that will make a difference?
