2022.01 Enact Federal Legislation to Reduce Food Loss and Waste

This resolution relating to *Community Life* was adopted in 102nd annual national convention in Kelowna. Submitted by Alberta Mackenzie Provincial Council, the resolution "... urges the federal government to enact legislation to reduce food loss and waste in Canada's agri-food, industrial, commercial and institutional sectors."

Faith, Service and Social Justice

On August 24th, 2022, the national board advised the standing committees will be reduced to three, and released the <u>new Faith, Service</u> and <u>Social Justice Guidelines</u> (found at: https://cwl.ca/wp-content/uploads/2022/08/Faith-Service-and-Social-Justice-Guidelines.pdf).

Current **CL** responsibilities include: dignity and rights of persons; social and economic justice; refugees, immigration and citizenship; Development and Peace; and developing countries. The first two will fall under **social justice** and final three under **service**. The guidelines will assist councils to transition to the new structure.

Let us embrace this transition with the same conviction as Bellelle Guerin when she began her journey to form the League over 100 years ago. The world is changing ... we need to do the same.
