As such, the Education and Health chair position continues in some councils and dioceses through Spring 2024 and at the Ontario Provincial Council through July 2024.

Newly Revised League Resources

League resources have been updated to reflect the new executive structure with the 2022 constitutional amendments. These include the Constitution & Bylaws (2022), National Manual of Policy and Procedure and other League resources, toolkits, etc. now posted on the national website in the 600 Series Manuals. The Executive Handbook has been discontinued.

Single-Use Plastics Ban

The manufacture and import of single-use plastic (SUP) for sale in Canada ban came into effect on Dec. 20, 2022 and will no longer be available for purchase by Dec. 20, 2023. The six categories of products banned are straws, stir sticks, check out plastic bags, cutlery, some takeout containers and six pack rings. These products were chosen as available alternatives for them already exists. The ban addresses the environmental pollution from SUP by moving away from a linear economy of single use to a circular economy of multiple uses through better product design, reuse, recycling, etc. which are better for the environment. The Government of Canada Environment and Natural Resources website indicates that "Canadians throw away over 3 million tonnes of plastic waste every year. Only 9% is recycled while the rest ends up in our landfills, waste-to-energy facilities or the environment." See links below for more info on the SUP from Government of Canada

Catholic Education School Support

There are 29 English and eight French Catholic school boards in Ontario. The future of Catholic Education in Ontario depends on all of us. All Catholics are eligible to support Catholic education even if they do not have children currently attending school. They also need to register as an English or French Separate Catholic supporter when they change residence on their Tax Bill or Property Assessment Notice or on the Voter Information Card. A Separate School Support Lease form allows individuals who jointly own or rent a property to designate school support to the Separate School Board when one of the owners or tenants is non-Catholic. The Tax Direction and Lease Information forms are available on all Catholic school board websites or municipal clerk's office. Canadian Blood Services: CWL Blood Donors

The need for blood donations continues. Members are encouraged to give blood if they are eligible. The previous link for members to donate blood through Canadian Blood Services is inactive. Members wishing to donate blood are to visit blood.ca/, select ways-donate/partners-life/group-donations-and-pledge-based-partnerships. Members will need to complete the registration to set up a new donor account if they do not have one. Once the account is set up, then choose *Partners for Life* to join an existing team which is the "The Catholic Women's League of Canada."
