Thank you to everyone who had the opportunity to complete the resolution survey. Although the number of respondents were few, the input and feedback provided was very insightful and encouraging for the future of resolutions. I've captured a few of the highlights:

Of those that responded to the question *Would you be willing to be part of a team to do resolutions work* – 15% responded Yes and 52% responded Maybe.

When asked Why do you like resolutions and what fuels your interest in resolutions – Same and similar answers were repeated throughout and they were all very telling.
