## World Water: Wed. March 22<sup>nd</sup>

It is a UN observance day, with the aim to highlight the importance of <u>freshwater</u>. The theme of World Water Day 2023 is *Groundwater: Making the Invisible Visible*. The theme highlights the importance of groundwater to our environment. World Water Day is to support the achievement of the UN's Sustainable Development Goal 6: water and sanitation for all by 2030. Earth Hour encourages individuals, communities and businesses to turn off all non-essential lights and electrics for an hour. The first event started in Sydney in Australia in 2007. The goal is to help raise awareness around the globe of our energy use, consumption, impact and long-lasting effects on the environment. This draws attention to the issues of climate change and global warming.

Earth Day seeks to highlight and promote efforts dedicated to the protection of the environment. "Invest in Our Planet." As we enter the 21st century, we face many environmental crises including global warming, deforestation, endangered wildlife,



shortages of potable water, and widespread pollution. These crises negatively affect our planet's resources, and they pose serious risk to our long-term lifestyles and health.
