



Inform the Membership of the League's Position on Current Issues, Priorities and New Programs

The following national priorities were introduced, discussed, and acted upon:

- Communiqués received from national officers were forwarded to their provincial counterparts. Members were encouraged to support suggestions, implement programs, and offer their services for working groups.
- Councils were informed about the Unity Outreach Project, and many looked forward to implementing it.
- Many councils participated in 12-Hours-of-Prayer for Palliative Care.

The following provincial priorities were introduced, discussed, and acted upon:

- Continued to focus on the theme "Loneliness" by encouraging outreach through phone calls and visits, the development of a resolution on the topic, sharing information about the causes and effects of loneliness with government officials.
- Following the installation of the newly elected executive, the theme "Go Make a Difference!" was introduced.
- Provincial officers and diocesan presidents developed webinars, projects, and initiatives to make a noticeable difference in society by providing service to the less fortunate, increasing the awareness of social justice issues and increasing the faith of members.
- Awareness of Indigenous issues was developed by wearing orange on Truth and Reconciliation Day, virtually praying reconciliation rosaries on that day and on the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe as well as sharing information through directives and in the *ON-Line* Newsletter.

Foster Open Communication

- Attended an in-person meeting with the Assembly of Catholic Bishops of Ontario (ACBO), informed them about the work being done by the League provincially and resolutions topics being studied.
- Communications from the Ontario Provincial Council were fostered through: The *ON-Line Newsletter*, the website and Facebook page.
- Oral and written reports at executive meetings.
- Directives from provincial officers to counterparts.
- In-person and virtual meetings for the whole executive but also virtual meetings between the provincial executive and their diocesan counterparts.

Preside at All Meetings of the Council

- The provincial convention was held in-person for the first time in several years, however the pre-convention and administrative committee meetings were virtual.
- Executive and administrative committee meetings were held both in-person and virtually.

Be a Signing Officer for All Official Documents

- Together with the treasurer and secretary, reviewed claim forms and signed cheques.
- Together with the resolutions chair, sent letters requesting visits with the Ontario premier and other government officials.

Initiate Policy, in Consultation with the Officers

- Provincial officers and diocesan presidents developed webinars, projects and initiatives to make a noticeable difference in society by providing service to the less fortunate, increasing the awareness of social justice issues and increasing the faith of members.
- Provincial manuals were reviewed and updated, as required.
- Directives from provincial officers were shared via email with diocesan counterparts and other executive members and posted on the provincial website.

Be an Advisory Member of Committees

- Chaired the Administrative Committee.
- Was a member, *ex officio*, of Policy and Guidelines Review, Resolutions Review, Social Justice, Bishop Bernard F. Pappin Memorial Bursary, Truth and Reconciliation, and Government Visitation committees.

Be the Official Spokesperson for the Council

- Represented the provincial council on the National Board.
- Made a presentation to the Assembly of Catholic Bishops of Ontario (ACBO) with President-elect Colleen Martin.
- Sent certificates to councils and members celebrating milestone events.

- All committee appointments were vetted by the president,

President's Activity Report

- Attended all provincial and national meetings, as required, and gave written and oral reports
- Together with the administrative assistant sent letters of congratulations, sympathy, and information.

- Wrote monthly “letters” and other articles for the *ON-Line* Newsletter, as well as directives and memos when required.
- Participated in webinars hosted by national officers, provincial officers, and other groups.
- Initiated monthly virtual meetings with diocesan presidents.
- Made presentations to diocesan and parish councils whenever invited to do so
- Assisted with the preparations for upcoming and future provincial conventions.

Recommendations

- Encourage the open communication of ideas between levels to foster the education of members and to develop leadership for the future.
- Offer regularly scheduled leadership courses to educate members who accept new executive positions.
- Ensure that mentorship is offered to members accepting executive positions

Spiritual Development Standing Committee Report 2022

For each of the following, describe ways parish and diocesan councils assisted members:

In their communal and personal prayer life in 2022?

- Each diocese reported that most parish councils shared information from Catholic sources.
- 11 diocesan councils used websites and virtual programs to enhance the spiritual growth of members.
- Diocesan and parish councils shared spiritual reflections and prayers via Facebook and their websites.
- 6 diocesan councils reported 50% of parish councils used resources from National website.
- All dioceses offered prayers/reflections or retreats to acknowledge the National Day for Truth & Reconciliation.
- 1 diocesan council created online monthly newsletter titled 'Catholic Connections'.
- Diocesan and parish council members participated in Rosary Sunday at Martyrs' Shrine in Midland, Ontario.

In their growth in Catholic faith?

- All diocesan councils and 60% of parish councils used virtual retreats/prayers/rosaries.
- 9 diocesan councils reported members attended spiritual book clubs organized by diocesan councils and parish councils.
- 10 diocesan councils reported that parish councils registered for online presentations from sources such as Novalis, National Catholic Broadcast Council, Ignatian Spirituality, Loyola Press and Formed.
- 1 diocesan spiritual chair and parish priest facilitated Formed course, "The Sanctuary Course for Catholics"

In being up to date on the role of women in the church?

- Approximately 2/3 of parish councils reported studying documents from the Vatican regarding the role of women in the church.
- A small number invited guest speakers to speak on this topic.

Describe ways, parish and diocesan councils supported women and men discerning their vocation.

- 95% of parish councils gave monetary gifts to seminarians directly or through the Bishop Bernard F. Pappin Memorial Bursary.
- All councils offered prayer services, Masses and/or Living Rosary.
- Many councils supported through the Serra Club.

- Members in 2 dioceses attended ordinations and liturgies of person(s) taking religious vows.
- Vocation cross prayers and Travelling Crucifix were used in one diocese.
- Daisy and Trillium prayers.
- Advent Rosary chain, rosary prayed daily throughout Advent for vocations.

Chairperson's Activities Report

- Prepared prayers and prayer services for administration and executive meetings.
- Hosted virtual meetings with diocesan chairpersons.
- Prepared reports, monthly newsletter articles, and directives.
- Forwarded information received from National chairperson.
- Created 'Go Make a Difference' initiative-CWL Synodality.
- Attended in-person and virtual administration and executive meetings.

Recommendations

- Provide on national website step by step tutorial detailing instructions for parish councils on how to report deceased members.
- Continue to use virtual meetings to stay connected to counterparts and assist with any issues discussed.
- Continue to encourage variety of communication platforms at all levels to advise and engage members.
- All councils recommended the League create various tools and events to enhance spiritual life of members.
- All councils encouraged asking Spiritual Advisors to act as a resource for spiritual activities.

Annual Membership Drive

- Parish councils from all 13 dioceses reported engaging in an annual membership drive most at the expected November timeline.
- Many and varied activities were undertaken to recruit members including:

Info sessions for members

- Councils note that the regular monthly meetings are the main information session hosted for members, and minutes are circulated for reference.
- Many councils offered specific sessions on topics shared by standing chairs or officers.
- Annual letter circulated with activities and accomplishments.
- Members are also kept up to date with bulleting inserts, bulletin board postings, social media posts and emails.

Info session for prospective members

- Eleven councils reported hosting information sessions for non-members.
- It is noted that one to one personal contact is most effective to share information about the League.
- Welcome kits, CWL pin, scarf, Constitution & Bu-laws, League Prayer card, and Catholic & Living It! cards were used by various councils to welcome new members.

What resources/assistance would parish councils like to have?

- Many councils indicated they would like to have additional resources and assistance without specifics.
- Membership recruitment is a recurring theme for needed resources and assistance particularly for younger future members.
- New ideas for prayer services and spiritual development.
- The national, provincial, and diocesan websites are cited as places to access reference materials so continue to update regularly.
- More regular communication to the parish level from national.
- Would like a tool to use for planning a retreat.

Were there frequently asked questions (FAQs) on the duties of President-Elect/ Organization? Describe the FAQs and how you answered or assisted with obtaining an answer.

- There was confusion because of the changes in communication channels and timing of the launch of the realigned annual reporting process.
- A lot of questions were asked regarding the membership fee increase.

Chairperson's Activity Report

- Invited diocesan counterparts to participate in zoom planning meetings to discuss tools and process to support parishes in recruitment and retention.
- Established monthly league development zooms on various topics open to all members.
- Prepared directives, reports, newsletter contributions as necessary.
- Began the process for review and revision of provincial policy, procedure, and guidelines to reflect the new three pillar structure: faith, service, and social justice.

Recommendations

- Future amendment of policy to include zoom vote option for Life membership nomination.
- Provide access for diocesan organization/membership person to the membership database for the diocesan members to allow analysis and resulting strategy to retain membership, report on renewal rates, and celebrate new recruits.
- Reschedule the timing for completion of annual reports by parish councils given holiday timeframe - consider January timing as a project timeline for councils.
- Share information with the membership on what the results of the annual survey are used for; how they can be used to determine when new strategies may be required for marketing initiatives, tools and/or membership.
- Step-by-step instructions with screen shots for new membership coordinators and those switching from paper to online.
- Large, printed posters and colour pamphlets to hand out.
- When providing new resources, host a webinar to explain how each is laid out and suggestions on how to make use of them effectively,

- Connecting with life members in nursing homes and those with dementia.
- Motivating capable members to accept leadership positions.
- Engaging new and younger women to fill the void.
- Supporting Life Members faced with suffering due to illness and loss of loved ones.
- Lack of support from clergy.
- Use of technology when members lack access to computers to receive information.
- Mentoring officers in the new format and structure from strategic initiatives.
- Mentoring members through an amalgamation process.

Greatest Accomplishments

- Fulfilled duties and was supportive even under great adversity.
- Achieved success in keeping parish councils operating with many challenges.
- Filled the position of council president due to mentoring of life members.
- Collaborated to complete parish council and diocesan council history books.
- Provided educational opportunities for members to learn more about our Indigenous sisters and brothers.
- Participated in the Gratitude Project, Fireside Chat, and a living rosary on Our Lady's feasts days, all projects beneficial to members spiritual development.
- Held a luncheon to communicate and answer questions regarding amalgamation, participated in preparations for related archiving and setting up of committees, and established a policy and procedure for the amalgamation of two diocesan councils.

Support for Marriage and Families

- Participated in parish Ministry for Marriage and Family courses, “nana programs” to assist new moms, and children’s liturgy
- Provided sacramental preparation and gifts, monetary aid, food baskets, clothing donations for families in need.
- Shared family life information and had guest speakers at meetings.
- Hosted events, luncheons, potlucks, ice cream Sundays, hospitality after masses, funeral luncheons, card parties, Christian based movie nights, children’s parties, family day retreats.
- Sent cards/gifts for special occasions: thinking of you, get well, and sympathy.
- Promoted National Week for Life and Family, World Day for Grandparents, 10th World Meeting of Families in Rome.
- Offered prayers specifically for members’ concerns regarding families.
- Supported a family in India and a girl in Kenya.

Uphold or Advocate for the Sanctity of Life

- Informed/educated members; attended workshops, Life Chain, Walk for Life, 40 Days for Life; and, participated in 12 Hours of Prayer for Palliative Care, TAD-CCAT Palliative Project to distribute the CCCB Horizons of Hope 4-part module program, rally for the unborn child in October 2022.
- Studied legislations regarding euthanasia, protection from coercion of conscience for healthcare workers, palliative care, and abortion issues.
- Communicated to all levels of government both in person and through letters, postcards, and petitions for pro-life, end of life, and palliative care issues.
- Donated to pro-life charities, Birthright, Right to Life, Euthanasia Prevention Coalition, Campaign Life Coalition, local hospices, local pregnancy centres, Gianna Home for Unwed Mothers, Rose of Sharon.
- Hosted the DVD “Unplanned” and baby showers.
- Planted a garden for sanctity of life with memorial cross for the unborn child.
- Offered prayers, rosary recitations, Masses for sanctity of life.

Support of Youth

- Provided annual graduation awards, bursaries, scholarships, financial assistance, winter clothing, food supplies to a youth centre, weekly bulletins for children’s liturgy, and purchased children’s books of faith.
- Supported the elementary breakfast/lunch programs.
- Participated in sacramental preparations and provided receptions and gifts.
- Supported Squires, NET program, hosted/supported summer youth camps.

- Provided financial assistance for a youth to attend a diocesan Young Adult Retreat, youth to attend World Youth Day, to an orphan in a third world country through Chalice, to a youth in Kenya.
- Started and/or volunteered at children's liturgy RCIA programs.
- Hosted events, parties, rallies, baseball games, and games night.
- Invited members of the Catholic Girls League to join CWL events.
- Helped secondary students get community service hours.
- Hosted presentations and discussions related to youth issues.

Reach Out and Provide Ministry to Others

- Made phone calls, sent emails and cards, carolled at seniors' residences, provided rides, and made personal visits to lonely, elderly, and sick.
- Offered masses, prayer services, and delivered Eucharist to home bound.
- Provided financial donations to D&P, Ukraine relief, Save a Family, Mater Care International, Madonna House, St. Vincent de Paul, and Salvation Army.
- Participated in preparation and distribution of care kits, preparation of Christmas hampers, provision of winter clothing to homeless, prayer shawls, lunch programs, Christmas Cheer, Out of the Cold programs, computer classes, soup kitchens, food banks, Meals on Wheels, funeral luncheons, community lunch programs, toy drives, women in crisis centres, and CWL honour guards.
- Donated time and services to seniors' organizations.
- Provided bereavement support, grief seminar information.

2nd National Day for Truth and Reconciliation – September 30, 2022

150 parishes participated by attending mass, prayer services, Indigenous ceremonies, retreats, walks, information session on Circle of Turtle Lodge, Healing Circles, Hamilton Diocesan Indigenous 8-week series, ceremony for *children's shoes* displayed before altar, Ottawa national ceremony, Diocesan Landscape of Nations Event, by joining Reconciliation Rosary; wearing orange, presenting *World Views on Language Loss: The Impact on Indigenous Peoples*, enrolling in Indigenous courses/parish dialogue circles, purchasing Indigenous goods, planting a garden; focusing on Indigenous concerns and including land acknowledgment at meetings; hosting presentations by Indigenous leaders; and holding a prayer service focusing Our Lady of Guadalupe icon and a statue of St. Kateri Tekakwitha.

National Food Bank Project

186 parishes participated. Majority felt the project was helpful in building community. Councils continued to collect goods for food banks, St. Vincent de Paul Society, and Christmas food hampers; supported Children's Christmas Basket Fund, Mary's Meals, Canadian Children for Food; donated cash/vouchers; members volunteered at food banks; one council financially supported Sr. Kathryn's Pantry, another council supported Dr. Simone's Food for Children Charity, and a parish supported snack and breakfast programs at two Catholic schools. One diocese collected 6,000 pounds of food in collaboration with the Knights of Columbus.

National Webinar on Human Trafficking by Joy Smith

42 parishes participated. Councils learned the extent of human trafficking, how it exploits the person, the difficulty in legislating it, ways to prevent it, how to be aware of suspicious activity and to recognize victims, of victim resources available, and how to use the anti-human trafficking study guide. Councils prayed to St. Josephine Bakhita to intercede for victims. One council is determined to do more to protect all grandchildren. Councils were surprised at the number of people trafficked and how many young, homeless children are targeted. Councils also participated in local presentations and invited guest speakers on the topic.

Assisting Ukrainian refugees in transition to their new life in Canada?

124 parishes participated through prayer, financial assistance, clothing/household donations; donating to New Canadian Centre, sponsoring a child, supporting a medical team going to Ukraine, hosting Good Friday Hunger Meal with proceeds to Ukrainian Refugees Fund. Quilted banner was created to honor refugees. Quilts were donated to families. A member hosted a refugee family of 6 and the council donated food/clothing. A council prayed for a refugee family sponsored by a school. Members wore blue/yellow ribbons, participated in Prayer Day for Peace in Ukraine. Councils offered support through transportation, translation and school enrollment.

Several councils studied topics with intent to prepare resolutions including the definition of human remains in the Canada Criminal Code, palliative care, Indigenous equality, and the lack of doctors.

The amounts noted in the survey were substantially less than what was reported directly to the treasurer. It is believed that this is because some parish councils did not complete the surveys. Regardless, the parish councils were generous indeed!

Additional Comments by Councils

- One council supported the Safe & Secure Child Initiative in Nigeria as suggested by a parish priest.
- A parish council using pre-authorized debit plan to pay their membership dues found it difficult national only took one withdrawal and the membership coordinator did not receive an email with the amount due/withdrawn. Treasurer was only alerted to the amount removed when she received her bank statement. They have 104 members but National only withdrew money for 78. Although the council tried to contact National no response was received.
- A big challenge, due to Covid was access to banks. In some cases, local branch was closed which increased travel distance.
- Covid impacted the ability to donate to charities due to lack of funds.
- Councils in Ontario were invited to donate to assist Ukrainians. In Toronto, a total of \$13,155.45 was collected across the diocese as well as \$1500 donated directly by Toronto Diocesan council.
- Ensured that all donations towards the Voluntary Funds were acknowledged through emails.
- One diocese collects an annual donation from each parish but did not collect in 2022 to relieve some of the financial pressure of COVID.

Chairperson's Activities Report

- I completed all the duties associated with the Treasurer, including posting entries, reconciling the books, preparing budgets, booking reservations, and keeping membership reports up to date.

- I completed the 3 hr. On-Line course at the First Nations University of Canada - 4 Seasons of Reconciliation.
- I attended all meetings and conventions in person or via Zoom.
- Kept everyone apprised of the GICs that came due and renewed them as directed.

Recommendations

- Some new Treasurers reported not receiving guidance from previous Treasurers, so it is recommended training sessions be offered to provide guidance on the responsibilities including:
 - Clarification on any concerns with the use of e-transfer to receive payments.
 - Instruction on a safe website to convert PDF documents to Word to complete forms received in a PDF format.
 - Specific instruction on completing forms required by diocesan, provincial and/or national.
 - Providing general information on lottery accounts and the use of funds for parish needs versus donation to registered charities.
 - Providing clarification on the new Policy and Procedure "Amalgamating a Diocesan Council" for those experiencing that situation.
- On both parish and diocesan councils, the position of Treasurer should be held by someone with at least a basic accounting knowledge to track income and expenses, reconcile accounts, prepare a budget and report to members in a format that members can understand.
- There should be notes at all levels as to what, where and when activities happen and how they are recorded so that there is consistency in record keeping and timelines.
- Develop policy and procedure for use of e-transfer as this option becomes more accepted.
- Review guidelines for treasurer regularly to ensure policy and procedures remain clear, concise not open to subjective interpretation.

 - Pillars were explained at the fall regional meetings (3) using a power point presentation developed by another diocese.

 - A quiz followed, where the executive mingled with everyone to provide additional clarification.
 - Information about the three pillars was posted on our diocesan website.
 - Regional chairs further discussed the changes at their meetings.

- Used the theme prayer, hosted spiritual retreats and spiritual reflections based on the theme, welcomed others and included all members, identified gifts and strengths of members to encourage them; volunteered with events at church; took up offertory gifts so the Catholic Women's League of Canada members were visual to parish family, included "Catholic and Living It" tip of the month in newsletters and communiques, participated in Catholic spiritual prayers as community and individually.
- Put the theme on all correspondence, in the parish bulletin, news publication was identified as "Catholic and Living It"; wrote cards to long term care homes and prayed for them at meetings; visited or called members regularly; reached out to those that needed some connection and support, sent out Christ-centred Christmas cards; participated in a campaign to share the history of your life or a member's life with others especially elder members, and had members share what "Catholic and Living It" meant to them.
- Encouraged participation in activities out and among the community to be visually present as "Catholics and Living It!"

Describe how parish spiritual advisors, and your diocesan spiritual advisor, showed support for the League in your diocese and provide any

- Our diocese incorporates a model of “families of parishes” where one pastor is responsible for all the parishes in his family. If the priest is the spiritual advisor for all parishes, it is difficult to participate fully. A few pastors met with presidents of the parish councils in the family quarterly and made it clear that he would make himself available where needed but in others it was not made clear who or if they had a spiritual advisor.
- Some Spiritual advisors attended meetings, celebrated special masses, provided spiritual reflections, attended events, and contributed to newsletters and most were accessible through emails.
- Recommendations:
 - There needs to be more communication between the pastor (spiritual advisor) and the council president for greater understanding of expectations; and, where the pastor is too busy, consideration to appoint another person, an associate pastor, deacon, sister, or lay-person so councils always have a spiritual advisor.
 - Every council should download the handbook for Spiritual advisors from the national website and where needed ask the diocesan spiritual advisor to liaison with pastors to encourage communication.

In point form below, describe any unusual initiatives facilitated by the Diocesan council in 2022 not specific to any standing committee.

- Hosted an online Lenten retreat that was well attended.
- Presentation by Kathy Matusiak, new executive director of Community Compassionate Care (CCC) on the importance of this program during times of loneliness and separation; the-solution to euthanasia is human connections.
- “My Story”, an initiative between CCC and the London Diocesan members to help those we interviewed see they are valuable, they are heard, and are respected. It emphasized that human connections are crucial.
- One regional chair hosted an online diocesan fun night which consisted of skits, jokes, music and painting.
- Hosted a legislation and resolution workshop and later posted a recording to the diocesan website.
- Held Google training for executive members at an executive meeting.

- Councils expressed happiness with the reduction in the number of chairs, citing simplicity, ease of filling fewer positions, streamlining and that it encouraged working as a team.
- Others felt the structure would not make a big difference as former positions were rarely filled anyway, and some were unsure or worried about how to make the changes.
- Some mentioned waiting for more information and revised constitution and by-laws before implementation while others were prepared to conduct their next elections with the new structure based on information already received.
- Diocesan attended general meetings to discuss the new structure if requested and provided information through communication and at diocesan gatherings.
- Most councils reported they did not ask for guidance from the diocesan/provincial councils, 2 councils asked for help and found it very helpful, and 2 councils found it somewhat helpful.

Describe how your diocese collectively and parishes individually worked with the national theme *Catholic and Living It!!* In 2022.

- As a diocesan council, parish councils were informed of the new theme, and the theme was used for executive meetings and diocesan events.
- For the diocesan annual convention 2022, students at the host council Catholic school produced and displayed artwork with the theme, and councils were encouraged to report on activities related to the theme.
- Councils were visible in the community attending events such as DeVeber webinar on palliative care, 12 hours for Palliative Care, Right to Life, Life Chain, Rosary Rally, World Day of Prayer, Suppers, Bazaars, Diocesan Evangelization Initiative (Catherine's Star Flowers), online daily Divine Mercy Chaplet, Church ministries, Friendship Sundays after mass, and supported local, national, and international charities.
- Reached out to shut-ins through phone calls, visits, Christmas gifts, cards sent, supported 2 families impacted by loss of home to fire, and took up a pyjama collection for needy children.
- Councils reported use of the PowerPoint provided by national office, recited the prayer, encouraged members to view Barb Dowding's "the Art of Accompaniment," and supported postcard campaign to stop expansion of MAiD.
- Initiated Travelling Mary (suitcase containing a statue of Mary and prayers

which travels between classrooms at local catholic school). She is now shared between 3 Catholic schools.

Describe how parish spiritual advisors, and your diocesan spiritual advisor, showed support for the League in your diocese and provide any recommendation(s) you may have for future relationships between councils and spiritual advisors.

- The Diocesan Spiritual Advisor supported the theme Catholic and Living It! and incorporated it into his sharing and spiritual reflections for meetings and the Spiritual Day of Reflection (in person), and our Lenten and Advent Reflections (virtual).
- Strongly encouraged us to incorporate and inform members about our Bishops evangelization prayer campaign (Blessed Catherine's Starflowers).
- Offers advice on topics and prayers for meetings.
- It was reported that most parish spiritual advisors were supportive in some way.
- Many came to meetings, made announcements of events at mass, encouraged membership from the pulpit, provided access to parish facilities and one even supported purchase of Maple Leaf pins financially.

- The Diocesan Chairs met 4 times per year and worked together on planning, ideas, themes, events, and the budget. Prior to this, it was not done as a group sharing ideas but rather a quick update at Executive meeting as to what was planned and response to any completed activities.

- Every diocesan president should create an information package to pass to the incoming president including month by month calendar of events and responsibilities. Example – January – OPC meeting; what is the time needed, what to do, what to expect with copies of materials as a reference.
- Recommend national encourage flexibility at the parish council level with some of the policy and procedure needed for the national level but not necessarily required at the local parish level. Long-time members require the policy and procedure be followed word for word but flexibility, for instance with required positions, is better than councils folding due to not having a president.

- Presidents reported that they have incorporated less business/reports at general meetings and more focus on faith, service, and social justice activities.

- Councils lived out the theme Catholic and Living It! by assisting with sacramental preparation, activities that supported their local food banks, worked with local service organizations to help with community Christmas baskets, increased spiritual elements, supported ministries within their parish, Coffee Sundays which facilitated community building within their parishes, collected 200 "Backpacks of Love", in addition to 150 supplemental bags, 6 trunk loads of donated warm winter wear as well as 50 pairs of new winter boots to support the various campaigns for the Compassionate Committee for the Homeless, donated handmade lap blankets and muffs for those with Alzheimer's at their local hospital, created a warm, welcome parish home for United Church members whose church had closed, holding living rosaries, outreach to shut-in and lonely members, shared their gift of time and talent for funeral luncheons, prayed the rosary for vocations to the priesthood, religious life and married life, the deceased, and children being exploited and abused.

- Those councils that had elections (about 1/3) attended training sessions that were available, implemented themed meetings focused on one of the 3 standing chairs, and raised awareness at each meeting on new structure using resources from League websites.
- Councils described being excited about the stream-lined structure, that it enabled members to bring relevancy to current issues and should lead to more efficient meetings.
- Councils mentioned being hopeful the new structure would generate interest in members to run for executive positions and younger members to join the League.
- Some councils started looking at their previous activities and seeing how they would fit into the new format to determine needed changes.
- The Diocesan Council was proactive; it offered virtual training sessions and encouraged the use of League websites at all levels.
- Diocesan council provided parish executive training sessions in the fall as well as CWL Wednesday webinars throughout 2022, and updated councils monthly with information on resources available.
- The annual report asked about the new structure of the League which only came into effect in August. Most councils in this diocese were not yet in the structure so to ask their experience of it was premature.

- Diocesan development day title was Living Justice: A CWL Response to Catholic Social Teaching principles (Human Dignity, Solidarity and The Dignity of Work and Rights of Workers) were presented by Development and Peace and then applied to the standing committees.
- Diocesan held special events reflecting the theme: Prayer Service and Rosary for Ukraine, June 21 National Indigenous Peoples Day, Sept. 30 National Day for Truth and Reconciliation Education Forum
- Parish councils held retreats based on the theme, fundraised for organizations in the local community that address needs, placed the logo on correspondence as a reminder, held weekly zoom rosary, hosted advocacy awareness events, some councils cooperated with nearby councils on efforts, the theme prayer

card was distributed to members, and planned more advocacy awareness events to engage the parish.

- Many councils reported still not meeting in the first part of 2022 which was a struggle, but they continued to reach out and raise funds for their causes.
- One council suggested a spiritual theme be maintained in the future.
