Pope Leo XIV, at his first Mass at the Vatican stated, "A lack of faith is often tragically accompanied by the loss of meaning in life, the neglect of mercy, appalling violations of human dignity, the crisis of the family and so many other wounds that afflict our society."

Human dignity supports psychological well-being. Feeling valued and respected is essential for a person's mental and emotional health. It encourages peace and cooperation, it protects fundamental human rights and provides the moral basis for ensuring that people are not subjected to degrading treatment, discrimination, or oppression.

As women of deep faith, we have a moral obligation to ensure that every person lives with dignity and that we acknowledge their humanity through mutual respect, empathy, and understanding.

In this Jubilee of Hope, let us pray for the grace of spiritual renewal and transformation. May those most in need of being recognized as beloved human beings, created in the image and likeness of God, receive the respect and regard they deserve.
